

Travelers: Paul, Silas, Timothy, Luke, Priscilla, and Aquila

- Antioch of Syria: Paul and Barnabas disagree about who should go with them. Barnabas takes John Mark with him to Cyprus. Paul takes Silas. Acts 15:36–40
- Cilicia: Paul and Silas deliver a letter from the Jerusalem church. Acts 15:41 (Acts 15:22–29)
- Lystra: Timothy joins them. Acts 16:1–7
- Troas: Paul goes to Macedonia after receiving a vision of a man from there. Acts 16:8–10
- Philippi: Lydia becomes a Christian. When a fortune-telling slave girl also becomes a Christian, her owners riot. Paul and Silas are thrown in jail. The jailer also becomes a believer. Acts 16:11–40
- Thessalonica: A mob in Thessalonica tries to have Paul and Silas arrested. Acts 17:1–9

Distance: 2,800 miles (4,500 km)

Dates: AD 49-51

- Berea: Silas and Timothy stay in Berea while Paul goes on. Acts 17:10–15
- Athens: Paul sees an altar to an unknown god and preaches to the philosophers at the Areopagus (Mars Hill). Acts 17:16–34
- Corinth: Silas and Timothy rejoin Paul. He meets Priscilla and Aquila, who also join him. Acts 18:1–17
- Cenchreae: Paul gets his hair cut because he had taken a vow. Acts 18:18
- Ephesus: Paul establishes a church, leaving
 Priscilla and Aquila to tend to it. Acts 18:19–21
- Antioch of Syria: Paul returns to his home base of Antioch by way of Jerusalem. Acts 18:22
